Dear Parents

We hope you enjoyed some quality time with your child during the break. We are looking forward to an exciting and busy term. All the children have settled back into our class routines and are becoming more independent and responsible.

We would like to welcome Melissa West to our Year Four team for Term 2. Melissa will be teaching 4BC on Thursdays while Melissa Buske will be undertaking the role of Junior School and PYP Co-ordinator for Term 2.

Everyone is very excited about the upcoming Year Two and Year Four Production. Mrs Mavis Waddington will be teaching the Drama elements and Mrs Janine Crookes will teaching the Dance component to both Year Four classes. We will soon be asking for some volunteers to assist in various ways in preparation for the performance. A note will be sent home shortly in regard to this. All information about tickets and dates will be distributed at a later date.

# **Religious Education**

For the first half of the term our unit will focus on:

• Mary where children will explore Gospel stories of Mary's faithfulness. They will be encouraged to learn from the example of Mary and her response to God, as well as having opportunities to honour Mary through liturgy and prayer.

# Inquiry

Our unit of inquiry explores the Central Idea: "Earth's surface changes over time as a result of natural processes and human activity".

The lines of inquiry are:

- natural processes that affect the earth's surface
- the effect of natural phenomena on the landscape
- human activities that affect the earth's surface

Information Literacy: This term we will be continuing to build students reading comprehension skills by supporting them in their research and note-taking skills. We are using the 'New Learning' strategy to select and record important information for our Unit of Inquiry. We are also taking this a step further by concentrating on learning how to organise our notes effectively and efficiently.

#### **Mathematics**

Our aim is for students to acquire the mathematical knowledge, ways of thinking and confidence to apply mathematics in real and abstract situations. Multiplication facts will continue to be reinforced and students will need to continue to practise these regularly. Learning of these facts will assist students to further develop their mathematical fluency and stamina.





Topics we aim to explore in the first half of Term Two are:

- Mental computation building up a repertoire of strategies with a particular focus on subtraction
- Multiplication Facts
- The relationship between multiplication and division
- 2D shapes comparing & describing using a variety of attributes

Year 4 students will continue to be involved in the Numerical Acumen Challenge 2016 which is a long term challenge where students will build capacity with mental strategies. Five minutes a day is all that is needed to help improve their mental strategies in adding near tens, multiplication (x2, x3, x10) multiplication (x4,x6, x8, x9) Fractions (the ideas and comparing). In addition please encourage your child to continue to use the Mathletics website or app and complete activities which support and consolidate the topics taught in class.

#### Literacy

It is really important to not only listen to your child read, but to read to your child. This models expression, reading strategies and is quality time together.

The Premier's Reading Challenge ends in September, so please encourage your child to work towards and record the books they are reading.

We will be focussing on the strategy of questioning. Good readers ask questions before, during and after reading to better understand the author and the meaning of the text. This strategy will be explicitly taught as well as a focus strategy during independent reading groups.

This term our focus is on the genre of explanation which will be integrated into our unit of inquiry. The writing trait that will be our focus is sentence fluency. Sentence fluency is the flow of the language and the way the writing plays to the ear not just to the eye. We will be practising this strategy through our Writer's Notebook.

### French

Last term the Year 4 students learnt about the verbs "être" and "avoir" and common adjectives in order to describe their feelings and their families. They enjoyed creating imaginary families using famous people. The students made posters which are displayed in the French room and in the Year 4 classrooms.

The students enjoyed using the Duolingo iPad application as a way to continue their learning at home and make connections with their learning in French lessons. The students will continue to use this application as part of their French homework this term.

This term the students will extend their knowledge of adjectives to describe weather in French. In the second half of the term, the Year 4 classes will be investigating French Poetry through their Unit of Inquiry "Creating and responding to poetry develops an awareness of ourselves and the world around us". Students will use their knowledge of verbs and adjectives from last term to create their own French poems.
