What's happening in Year 4?

A special thanks to geologist Matthew Furness, Angus's father, who shared his knowledge with the class about how the earth's surface changes. Students were interested in the PowerPoint presentation and it was terrific that he sparked the children's curiosity. In Week 4 we walked to McElligott's Quarry and Mitcham Reserve and using iPads, collected evidence of weathering, erosion and deposition. Observing these natural processes in our local community helped consolidate our learning. A special thanks to the parents who joined us on our excursion.

Units of Inquiry:

We have just commenced our new Unit of Inquiry for How We Express Ourselves. Central Idea:

 Creating and responding to poetry develops an awareness of ourselves and the world around us.

Lines of Inquiry:

- How poetry communicates feelings, ideas and perceptions
- Poetic devices
- Personal preference in appreciation in poetry

Students will be exploring a wide range of poems and poetic devices and experimenting with their own creations. Feel free to share your favourite poem(s) with your child.

Science

This term we will be investigating a stand-alone Science unit with the Central Idea: Forces can be exerted by one object on another through direct contact or from a distance. Students will be involved in a range of hands-on activities to gain a deeper understanding of the impact of different forces, including push, pull, friction, magnetism and gravity.

Mathematics:

Topic we aim to explore for the remainder of the term:

- Multiplication Facts class focus on 4x, 8x, 3x & 6x
- The relationship between multiplication and division
- 2D shapes comparing & describing using a variety of attributes

Congratulations to those students who have demonstrated perseverance and commitment with the Numerical Acumen Challenge, resulting in gold, silver and bronze awards.





Religious Education

For the remainder of the term we will be focussing on:

• **Prayer and Liturgy** where students will examines a variety of liturgical celebrations and prayers and explain how prayer is a dynamic encounter with God.
